About the Exhibition

"Does the flap of a butterfly's wings in Brazil set off a tornado in Texas?" (Adapted from comments by Edward Lorenz in 1972)

Coming from different cultures and life experiences, Beverly Jacobs and Ann Phong found themselves addressing similar global issues from different perspectives. Both issues --- the ongoing pandemic and the disastrous global warming --- require worldwide cooperation to resolve. In their respective mediums of ceramic sculpture and mixed media paintings, their work begs the question: How can one individual's actions impact the environmental and public health of people far across the globe?

The two artists share common themes, executed with contrasting presentations: Phong often uses vibrant colors and layers of acrylic paint with embedded objects to invite the viewers to come closer to discover the dark layers of the context in them. On the other hand, Jacobs' ceramic sculptures suggest fragility, and, with their minimal surface treatment, are generally subdued in color.

"Some of my artwork is a serious examination of current issues; some of it is playful," says Jacobs. "A touch of playfulness helps to draw the viewer into an in-depth examination of the issues being addressed, so that the viewer will ponder the topic." And so it is with her ceramic sculptures in this exhibition. Some of the pieces evoke smiles, even as they address serious topics.

After earning a Ph.D. in physiology and working in the field, Beverly dipped her toes into art in her fourth decade of life and then became immersed in ceramics. Jacobs states, "My work is informed not only by artists such as Jean Arp, Alexander Archipenko, Henri Moore, and Constantin Brancusi, but also by the beauty of nature, my concerns about the world we live in, and my core beliefs."
